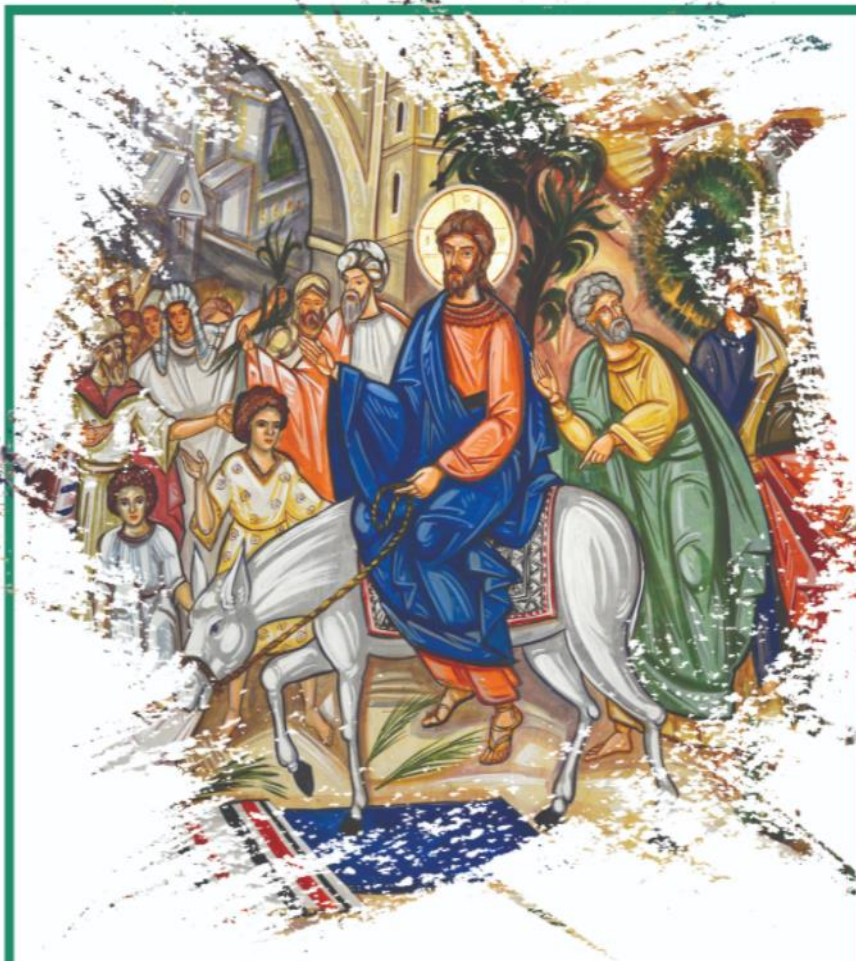

Come Celebrate Holy Week

This week we enter the most important time of the year when we as a Church celebrate the saving mysteries of Christ's passion, death, and resurrection. For the past seven weeks we have been journeying into the depths of our hearts asking God to renew and transform us so that we can experience more of God's abundant love and mercy and be better witnesses to the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Now comes the time for us to gather in prayer and to reflect on the undying love of God shown forth to us in the important three day celebration of the Triduum. The Triduum is the three holy days beginning with the Solemn Mass of the Lord's Supper, Good Friday, and the Solemn Easter Vigil. While the celebration contains three distinct celebrations, there is a beautiful continuity weaving through the entire three days connecting them together as one powerful celebration of Jesus' love for humankind.

Holy Thursday is a beautiful celebration that commemorates the institution of the Eucharist and the call for us to imitate Jesus' command to truly be servants who come "not to be served but to serve others (c.f. Mark 10:45). We also remember the institution of the ministerial priesthood. Holy Thursdays provides a powerful opportunity for each of us to renew our vocation and to recognize that Jesus has totally given himself to us so that we can totally give ourselves to others in his name.

Good Friday is solemn remembrance of Jesus' walk along the Via Dolorosa and his death on the cross. This is the only day throughout the year that we do not celebrate Mass. During this celebration we have the opportunity to contemplate and venerate the cross of Christ on which hung our salvation. Good Friday ends in silence with our hearts enthralled with anticipation of the Resurrection.

The Easter Vigil is the penultimate celebration of our identity as a Christian people. On this holy night we gather in darkness but end in total light surrounded by so many powerful reminders that Jesus Christ has risen from the dead and we have hope and a whole new way of life. We journey together through the Scriptures and through our salvation history, remembering with profound reverence the saving acts of God through human history. These saving acts find their culmination in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We have the wonderful privilege of bringing to the Church our catechumens and candidates who have been journeying with us and waiting for this beautiful night to fully join us through the Sacraments of initiation. Water, light, oil, music, bells, and beautiful art and flowers remind us of how much we are loved by God and that Jesus Christ has truly risen from the dead. We have glorious hope now to face anything and everything with courage because of the presence of Christ in our lives.

Please come and join us for the holiest week of the year and allow your heart to be touched and transformed in a new and exciting way.
